Recently when cleaning out some cupboards at work I discovered two old nests that I had put aside many years ago. I remember keeping them because of the unusual materials they contained.

I can't exactly remember now what species of bird made the first nest but I seem to recall it was an Australian Magpie or a Torresian Crow. I was surprised to see how much man-made material was present in this nest. It contained at least three different gauges of wire, red and blue electrical wire, green nylon twine and fishing line.

The second, and in my opinion the more beautifully constructed nest belonged to a Noisy Friarbird. This nest contained old computer printer paper, tissues and yellow twine.

Birds are obviously great recyclers and it is a good idea for us to follow their example, but on the other hand it is disgraceful to see how much rubbish we leave lying around, polluting our environment.

History in the making?

Will 2013 be the first time we record 250 species in a year within our local survey area?

In 2006, we put the idea out there and coined it the **Annual Challenge**. This year we are well positioned to give it a real shake if we are enthusiastic and dedicated enough. With 237 species so far and two months to go, we need six more species to beat the record of 242 set last year, and 13 more to crack 250. In the "Wanted List" below, the bolded species are those I consider the most likely prospects to get us over the line.
