TO INC. OR NOT TO INC., THAT IS THE QUESTION?

At the 1987 A.G.M. the Executive was asked to investigate the pros and cons of incorporation. This has been duly done, and I should like to take the opportunity tc discuss our findings before the members have to decide at the meeting on February 23rd.

ADVANTAGES

- Queensland is one of, if not the only, state to have Incorporation legislation. Its purpose is to assist small non-profit organisations such as ourselves in handling legal matters.

e.g. - ownership of property

- legal liability of committee and ordinary members.

- At present our Club has no legal entity therefore in the case where a person sues the Club for some reason, it is the individual members, particularly Committee members who would be liable - not the Club.

- Even if we feel it is irrelevant to our situation at the moment we should think of the future, perhaps it may be needed later on.

- Far larger bodies than ourselves have taken advantage of Incorporation. They must have looked into the issue as we have and decided it was worthwhile.

DISADVANTAGES

- It costs approximately \$45 to become Incorporated with an annual fee of \$15 (at present).

- We must have a Public Liability Insurance which costs approximately \$60 per annum. - We would have to change our Constitution.

DISCUSSION

Initially, I couldn't see the need for Incorporation, nor understand why there was a sudden rush of Incorporated organisations. Since finding out some facts and figures, I have been persuaded that it is beneficial.

The Legislation has only been in operation for about five years and is purely for the benefit of organisations such as ours, therefore I suggest we take advantage of it.

If you are not convinced, want to learn more about Incorporation, or simply love playing "devil's advocate" and enjoy lively debates, join the meeting <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 23rd</u>. The venue will be announced in next month's Newsletter.

We have some really interesting bird notes this month, so hold onto your binoculars as we burst into song and the new year!

The Cattle Egrets were the deepest Lesley had ever seen in that area of the range. Red-breasted Button Quail are probably far more common than are seen. They were flushed when lucerne was being cut.

If you thought that was good, what about this

The Waterbird Habitat is attracting quite a large number of species. The shy Marsh Crake is a good one to see in the reeds of the centre lagoon. Early morning viewing from the Aberdeen Street observation platforms is always lucrative.

Escapees feature prominently with Long billed Crellas being seen in the Iredale area and at the Waterbird Habitat. The latter has been sighted for about ten years now, always in the company of Galahs. It was interesting to note the Black-headed Finch that seemed to be quite at home with the Mannikins.

The sightings from Girraween National Park would be two of the more shy species of that area and would have been great birds to see.
