Some of the birds he had captured in unusual positions and in a couple of instances he had us guessing as to what bird we had in front of us, the little wattlebird being one of these. Two specimens were brought to the meeting - the first a rainbow bee-eater, the second a common bronzewing showing in this instance the white forehead (it can be buff) which is a fieldmark. The brush bronzewing has rufous on the nape and on the sides of his neck.

The concensus of opinion however is that the whiskered and rhite-winged black terms are much the same size and are virtually indistinguishable in the field in their non-breeding plumages.
